Webinar

EMC meetings can be observed via live webcast. Committee members must attend in person at one of the meeting's noticed locations, along with any members of the public that choose to attend. Members of the public may observe the meeting via webinar by registering at http://www.bof.fire.ca.gov/. Due to space limitations on its servers, the Committee may not preserve audio or video recordings of its meetings. If a quorum is present at a single location, the physical meetings may continue if the webinar broadcast is interrupted or terminated for any reason.

The Bagley-Keene Open Meetings Act only guarantees the right to offer public comment for individuals attending at a noticed location. However, the committee typically attempts to accommodate public comment from individuals observing via webcast from unnoticed locations, as described below. As stated on the Meeting Agenda, Board staff will address webcast participants prior to normal Committee business to provide guidance on meeting format and stakeholder participation.

Submitting A Comment: During the meeting, all participants will be muted by the meeting organizer. Participants will have an option to submit a comment, either by writing your comment or by directly addressing the members verbally. To submit a written comment, type the text of the comment in the "Questions" pane of the Webinar interface. To submit a comment by verbally addressing the members, select the "Raise Hand" icon on Webinar interface. The meeting organizer will call you by name and unmute you so you can address the Committee members. If you are commenting verbally, please be sure to unmute your phone or device.
