Report on Closed Session Items

The committee approved the meeting minutes from the February 26th closed session meeting. They also reviewed the April 2025 exam results and made a motion to accept them and send them to the Board of Forestry. Lastly, the committee reviewed the October exam; there was no action taken. There will be another review of the guestions. The closed session was adjourned.

Report of the Executive Officer Foresters Licensing

E.O. Stapleton presented the results of the 2025 RPF Employment Survey. According to the data, 27% of Registered Professional Foresters (RPFs) are retired, 28% are employed in private consulting, 25% work in the private industry, 2% are in local government, and 13% work for the State.

E.O. Stapleton noted that the high number of retired foresters raises budgetary concerns.

He also provided an overview of the fund condition report based on FY 2024. After weighing the expenses against the revenue, the budget forecasted a deficit. This financial outlook contributed to the recent increase in renewal fees.

Next, E.O. Stapleton shared the current Vital Statistics report.

During this year's renewals, 20 RPFs have withdrawn their registration, and 2 have voluntarily relinquished it. Additionally, there are still 71 RPFs and 15 Certified Rangeland Managers (CRMs) who have not yet renewed their license.

Currently, there are 1,052 valid RPF licenses and 62 valid CRM licenses. Including both valid and expired licenses, the total stands at 1,123 for RPFs and 77 for CRMs.

Finally, E.O. Stapleton reported a projected revenue increase of approximately \$58,000 due to the increase in renewal fees.

He mentioned that a statutory range increase proposal has been submitted to the legislature, but no confirmation of approval has been received yet.
