

CAL FIRE Urban and Community Forestry Grant Long-Term Tree Maintenance Plan

For any trees planted for a CAL FIRE grant project, applicants must either provide or ensure commitment to tree maintenance for a minimum of 3 years after the end of the grant period in accordance with [ANSI A-300 tree care standards](#), [International Society of Arboriculture \(ISA\) best management practices for tree care](#), and the standards outlined in the grant agreement and/or grant guidelines provided by CAL FIRE (i.e. CAL FIRE Grant Guidelines Appendix, Standards, Specifications and Recommended Resources for Purchasing, Planting, and Maintaining Trees).
