## Wildfire Prevention Grants Program



Reduction of Greenhouse Gas Emissions

Fewer wildfires
Reduction in total acres burned

#### **Grant Projects**

#### **Activity Types:**

- Hazardous Fuels Reduction
  - Prop 4 can only fund Hazardous Fuels Reduction Projects
- Wildfire Prevention Planning
- Wildfire Prevention Education

### **Priorities for CCI Funded Projects**

#### **Grant Allocation Priority**

- Fire Risk Reduction Community List (FRRCL)
- Low Income Communities, Disadvantaged Communities (Health and Safety Code 39713)
- Projects conducted by any local governmental entity qualified to perform defensible space assessments pursuant to Section 4291.5, if they utilize the common reporting platform

# **Priorities for Prop 4 Funded Projects**

#### **Grant Allocation Priority**

- Projects that benefit disadvantaged communities, severely disadvantaged communities, or vulnerable populations.
- Projects that includes the use of services of the California Conservation Corps or certified community conservation corps.
- Projects that leverage private, federal, and local funding or produce the greatest public benefit.
- Proposition 4 requires that at least 40 percent of the total funds available shall be allocated for projects that provide meaningful and direct benefits to vulnerable populations or disadvantaged communities. Of this 40 percent, at least 10 percent of the total funds available shall be allocated for projects that provide meaningful and direct benefits to severely disadvantaged communities.

# **Priority for All Funding**

#### Maintenance

- Projects that demonstrate that they are providing maintenance of existing fuels reduction projects paid for by CAL FIRE or any other funding sources (i.e., other state funds, federal funds, or private funds) will also receive priority.
- Maintenance of existing fuels reduction projects paid for by CAL FIRE or any other funding sources (i.e., other state funds, federal funds, or private funds).

Recommended funding amount is \$950,000 or less



Purchase of equipment not to exceed \$750,000 cumulative

# **Application Package Best Practices**

- Grant Guidelines
- > Relationship with local CAL FIRE Unit Foresters
- Submit all required documents in the Grants Portal
  - View the complete list in the Grant Guidelines
  - > Remember to complete the Budget Worksheet
  - > Remember to submit the application
  - Verify that signature forms are signed

# Application Package Best Practices Continued

#### **Project Naming and File Upload Guidelines**

- Use a file standard naming convention for all uploaded documents:
  - Unique Project Tracking Number plus document name
  - 25-WP-UUU-XXXXXXXXX-STD 204.pdf
  - The Project Tracking Number is auto-generated in the Grants Portal
  - Zip multiple files of the same type before uploading (e.g., maps, photos, etc.)
- Ensure consistency-data should match across all submitted forms and documents.

# **Application Package Best Practices Wrap-Up**

- > Report accurate treatment acreage
- > Funding total should match across all forms
- Complete and submit early!

### Budget

- Use correct budget categories (Grantee vs Contractual)
  - ➤ Supplies or Other <\$5,000
  - Equipment >\$5,000
- ➤ Include CEQA/NEPA costs, if applicable
- > Acres must match the application and SOW acres
- ➤ Mileage rates cannot exceed IRS allowable rates
- Complete the budget narrative at the bottom

#### Goals

- ➤ Acres of Fuels Reduction
- >Acres of Prescribed Fire
- ➤ Educational Events
- **≻**Community Plans

# California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)

Projects requiring CEQA review must provide documented compliance within 12 months from the grant execution.

Groundwork cannot begin until *CEQA* requirements have been completed.

Include CEQA costs into application package and budget.

Coordinate with your local Unit Forester for further CEQA details.

#### **Project Mapping Program**



<u>All</u> projects must submit a Geopoint

Geopoint should be the center of your project



Fuels Reduction projects require a Geopoint and Treatment polygon(s)

Drawing a polygon for the entire state of California is not acceptable
