
CAL FIRE Seed/Seedling Order Process

The Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (<u>CAL FIRE</u>) is responsible for appropriately stewarding the seed and seedling production at the L.A. Moran Reforestation Center (<u>LAMRC</u>). The Reforestation Center must observe and comply with directives laid out by the Public Resources Code regarding seed and nursery operations.



SEED REQUESTS

Requests for all seeds are to be submitted via the <u>request form</u> on the Reforestation Services Program page of CAL FIRE's website.

CAL FIRE will consider available seeds from the same <u>seed zone</u> and elevation as the planting site, as well as seeds from different seed zones and elevations considered to be at least moderately suitable by the Climate-Adapted Seed Tool Model developed by UC Davis and the United States Forest Service relative to projected future species migration (in production).

TIMELINE AND PRIORITY

Seed order requests will be accepted from **September 1st until December 31st** for that same year. Requests will be reviewed approximately every two weeks and prioritized based on the criteria below.

Requests made outside that timeframe may be considered depending on staffing availability.

*Species ordering deadline

Species	Submission times
Sugar Pine, Red Fir, White Fir	Sep 1st - October 31st
All other species	Sep 1st - December 31st

1st PRIORITY

Projects intended to reforest land severely disturbed by fire, flooding, pest outbreaks, disease, or other natural events where a Registered Professional Forester (RPF) has been consulted and a management plan is in place.

2nd PRIORITY

Restoration of native tree and plant species threatened with extinction, watershed, and riparian protection.

3rd PRIORITY

Land being reforested as part of a forest management plan (THP, NTMP, WFMP, etc.)

4th PRIORITY

Tree farms, biomass plantations, short-rotation forest products.

5th PRIORITY

Research and demonstration projects, including medical studies or trials, climate change adaptation and mitigation, public-benefit nursery start-ups, etc. Please note that additional information will be required.

6th PRIORITY

> Windbreaks, revegetation of utility and transportation corridors, and other site stabilization

For all priorities listed or for other intended uses, land ownership will be given preference in the following order:

- a) Privately-owned non-industrial and tribal lands
- b) State, regional, local government, and public lands
- c) Federal, privately-owned industrial and other lands

Prospective customers **will be contacted via email** within approximately two weeks of their inquiry submission with a determination as to whether the request can be fulfilled. If the customer **does not respond within 1 week of determination email, the request will be voided**.

PAYMENTS

CAL FIRE Seed Bank Staff will generate an invoice and email via DocuSign for the prospective customer to review, approve, complete, sign and return electronically. Customer will have 2 weeks from the submission DocuSign date to mail in payments. Currently, payments are only accepted via checks (either personal or cashier's check). Payment is required prior to seed shipment. CAL FIRE will not "hold" seed requests without payment.

SHIPPING

Except for research projects, CAL FIRE will only ship seeds directly to an established nursery and not a personal address. The customer is responsible for acquiring their own nursery space and any related nursery fees are not something handled by CAL FIRE.

Shipping prices are broken down below.

3 pounds or less: \$15.00 4-15 pounds: \$25.00 16-25 pounds: \$35.00 26-35 pounds: \$45.00

36 pounds and up: additional \$20.00 per 20 lbs. increment.

The California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection warrants to the extent of purchase price that seed sold is as described on the label, within the recognized tolerances. No other/further warranty, expressed or implied, is given. The State's Seed Lab is not an officially certified seed testing facility. Results of in-house testing should be used at purchaser's risk. The California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection claims no responsibility or liability for goods damaged or lost in shipping
