Fire Marshal Certification and Instructor Registration Update

Recommended Actions:

Approval of the Updates to the Fire Marshal Certification and Instructor Registration Update

Background Information:

In February 2018, the State Board of Fire Service approved the Fire Marshal (2018) Professional Qualifications and Curriculum. Over the last two years, steps in the certification process have been clarified, which better defines the Fire Marshal Certification and Registered Instructor requirements.

Analysis/Summary of Issue:

One of the educational requirements for Fire Marshal (2018) Certification is the completion of the G-290 Basic Public Information Officer (PIO) Course. After reviewing the course offerings, including the cost and length of training, the Curriculum Development Cadre requested that SFT evaluate other PIO training opportunities that would meet the intent. SFT Staff and the Curriculum Development Cadre determined that both the G-290 Basic Public Information Officer Course or the S-203 Introduction to Incident Information would meet the PIO education requirement.

After reviewing the instructor requirements, it was noted that the SFT Procedures Manual requires that an instructor applying to deliver the Fire Marshal courses have held the position of Fire Marshal within a Recognized Fire Agency in California for a minimum of three years. SFT Staff and the cadre determined that specific expertise should be added to each course to ensure that the instructor is a subject matter expert in the topic. By adding specific expertise for each of the Fire Marshal courses, this now aligns with other CFSTES courses instructor requirements.
