Fire Fighter II Tenured Path (2013) Implementation Plan

Recommended Actions:

Approve Fire Fighter II Tenured Path (2013) Implementation Plan

Background Information:

In a collaborative effort through the State Fire Training Steering Committee, a path to professional development has been identified as a need for the California fire service. Numerous departments are now participating in the State Fire Training system, with employees seeking to advance their career. As of January 2018, Firefighter I and II are the minimum requirements for entry into the state training system. Representatives from the above group have authored a nexus that emulates the professional development of the State Fire Training (SFT) Fire Fighter II certification track.

To accomplish this goal, this proposal will allow agencies to recognize members for FFII certification. The Implementation Plan details an application process and the tenured path retirement of December 31, 2021, which compliments the retirement of Fire Fighter II (2013). Applicants who do not apply before this date, shall utilize the Fire Fighter 2 (2019) certification, which requires Fire Fighter 2 certification exams.

Analysis/Summary of Issue:

Participating in the State Fire Training System has become the recognized training standard in the State of California. The system supports stakeholders as they meet the state and national minimums of training. To exist in a standard of excellence, agencies must have succession planning to keep improving constantly. The Tenured Path will serve as an entrance point for personnel that entered the fire service from >2008-2016. These

applicants are experienced personnel that did not submit a red scantron or complete the Fire Fighter I 2013 before Capstone testing was a requirement.

Fire Fighter II Tenured Path (2013)Available March 1, 2020

SFT will administratively update the Driver Operator Series Taskbook initiation requirements to accept either the State Fire Training FFI or FFII Tenured Path.

The FFII Tenured Path certification will be accepted when applying as a Registered Psychomotor Skills Evaluator.

Potential Agency Impacts:

Compliance with the timeline is crucial for the success of a FFII Certification Tenured Path application. Agencies shall be responsible for ensuring that each applicant has completed all Fire Fighter I and II (2013) educational requirements.

A Fire Fighter Training Record shall be required to be completed by the agency to provide a complete record of JPRs. A copy of the Fire Fighter Training Record shall be provided to the applicant. The Fire Fighter Training Record shall be maintained by the agency in accordance with the SFT Procedures Manual.



FIRE FIGHTER II TENURED PATH (2013) Implementation Plan

OVERVIEW

This document is intended to provide information for all State Fire Training (SFT) stakeholders on the Fire Fighter II Tenured Path (2013). Stakeholders are encouraged to study this information carefully and seek clarification from SFT if questions arise.

In a collaborative effort through the State Fire Training Steering Committee, a path to professional development has been identified as a need for the California fire service. Numerous departments are now participating in the State Fire Training system, with employees seeking to advance their career. As of January 2018, Firefighter I and II are the minimum requirements for entry into the state training system. Representatives from the Steering Committee and State Fire Training have authored a nexus that emulates the professional development of the State Fire Training (SFT) Fire Fighter II certification track. This path will allow agencies to recognize members for FFII certification.

FIRE FIGHTER II TENURED PATH (2013) APPLICATION PROCESS

Fire Fighter II Tenured Path (2013) Available March 1, 2020

Any agency with >10 applicants seeking to participate in the FFII Tenured Path (2013) shall identify a representative to serve as a liaison between its members and State Fire Training. All records shall be submitted digitally, following these instructions.

Incomplete submittals will result in the rejection of the entire digital file and all applicants listed. All fees submitted are non-refundable.

Paper Submittal

Any agency with <10 applicants shall submit the Fire Fighter II Tenured Path (2013) paper application and all required documents. Any incomplete submittals will result in the rejection of the application. All fees submitted are non-refundable.

FF II Tenured Path (2013) Task Book, signed by Fire Chief or Designee Confined Space Awareness Diploma (if not archived in ACADIS)

Certification Task Book:

The Fire Fighter I and Fire Fighter II Certification Task Books (2013) are combined to represent all job performance requirements (JPRs) for Fire Fighter II Tenured Path (2013) and shall be required for certification.

Experience Requirement:

The Fire Fighter II Tenured Path (2013) certification requires four (4) years of full-time or eight (8) years part-time/volunteer employment in a recognized fire agency in California as a Fire Fighter performing suppression duties.

Confined Space Rescue Awareness:

The Confined Space Rescue Awareness shall be SFT or IAFF) or Confined Space Rescue Technician (SFT). This is to meet California regulation (Cal-OSHA CCR Title 8, Article 108 §5157). Course diplomas that are archived in ACADIS are not required the be submitted as part of the application.

Educational Requirements:

- IS –100 Introduction to Incident Command System (FEMA), or SFT ICS-100, or ICS-200, or ICS-300, or CALFIRE I-100, or NWCG S-200, or NWCG S-300
- IS –700 National Incident Management System, An Introduction (FEMA)

FIRE FIGHTER II TENURED PATH (2013) RETIREMENT

POTENTIAL AGENCY IMPACTS

Compliance with the timeline is crucial for the success of a FFII Certification Tenured Path application. Agencies shall be responsible for ensuring that each applicant has completed Public Safety First-Aid, BLS Healthcare Provider/AED CPR, and all Fire Fighter I and II educational requirements.

A Fire Fighter Training Record shall be required to be completed by the agency to provide a complete record of JPRs. A copy of the Fire Fighter Training Record shall be provided to the

FIRE FIGHTER II (2013) TENURED PATH Certification Application Retires 12/31/2021

Overview

The California Office of the State Fire Marshal Fire Fighter II (2013) Certification is based on the NFPA 1001: Fire Fighter II Professional Qualifications set by the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA).

As of January 2018, Firefighter I and II are the minimum requirements for entry into the state training system. The Fire Fighter II (2013) Tenured Path Certification Application is for applicants who do not have a California Office of the State Fire Marshal Fire Fighter 1 certification, but are seeking Fire Fighter II (2013) certification through the Tenured Path program using both fire academy and work experience.

Applicants who have their California Office of the State Fire Marshal Fire Fighter I certification should apply using the Fire Fighter II (2013) Certification Application or the Fire Fighter 2 (2019) Certification Application.

Note: The Fire Fighter II (2013) Tenured Path Certification retires on December 31, 2021. Applicants who do not apply and meet the Fire Fighter II (2013) Tenured Path certification requirements before this date, shall seek the Fire Fighter 2 (2019) certification. The Fire Fighter 2 (2019) certification requires that applicants have a California Fire Fighter 1 certification and requires Fire Fighter 2 certification exams.

Application Process

The following are the steps for submitting Fire Fighter II (2013) Certification Application:

- Mail a Fire Fighter II (2013) Tenured Path Certification Application, supporting documents, and non-refundable fee to: State Fire Training, Tenured Path FFII Certification, 2251 Harvard Street, Ste 400, Sacramento, CA 95815
- 2. SFT conducts an application review.
 - a. If the candidate does not meet the eligibility requirements, SFT issues a denial.
- 3. SFT will issue your digital certification through the SFT User Portal at: https://osfm-sft.acadisonline.com/



Purpose

The State Fire Training certification task book is a performance-based document that identifies the minimum requirements necessary to perform the duties of that certification. Completion of a certification task book verifies that the candidate has the required experience, holds the required position, and has demonstrated the job performance requirements to obtain that certification.

Assumptions

State Fire Training holds the opinion that a Fire Fighter 1 or Fire Fighter 2 certification candidate may initiate a task book and obtain verification signatures for job performance requirements (JPR) demonstrated during training. A fire chief retains the option to require a candidate to repeat any JPR completed and signed off on during training and to document that performance with a second signature in the candidate's task book.

Each job JPR shall be evaluated after the candidate initiates the task book.

An evaluator may verify satisfactory execution of a JPR through the following methods:

- First-hand observation
- Review of documentation that verifies prior satisfactory execution

State Fire Training task books do not count towards the NWCG task book limit. There is no limit to the number of State Fire Training task books a candidate may pursue at one time if the candidate meets the initiation requirements of each.

It is the candidate's responsibility to routinely check the State Fire Training website for updates to an initiated task book. Any State Fire Training issued update or addendum is required for task book completion.

A candidate must complete a task book within five years its initiation date. Otherwise, a candidate must initiate a new task book using the certification's current published version.

Roles and Responsibilities

Candidate

The candidate is the individual pursuing certification.

Initiation

The candidate shall:

- 1. Complete all **Initiation Requirements**.
 - Please print or type.

Completion

The candidate shall:

- 1. Complete all **Job Performance Requirements**.
 - Ensure that an evaluator initials, signs, and dates each task to verify completion.
- 2. Complete all Completion Requirements.
- Sign and date the candidate verification statement under Review and Approval with a handwritten signature.
- 4. Obtain their chief's handwritten (not stamped) signature on the fire chief verification section.
- 5. Create and retain a physical or high-resolution digital copy of the complete task book.

Submission

The candidate shall:

- Submit a copy (physical or digital) of the completed task book and any supporting documentation to State Fire Training.
 - See **Submission and Review** below.

A candidate should not submit a task book until they have completed all requirements and obtained all signatures. State Fire Training will reject and return an incomplete task book.

Evaluator

An evaluator is any individual who verifies that the candidate can satisfactorily execute a job performance requirement (JPR).

An evaluator may verify satisfactory execution through the following methods:

- First-hand observation
- Review of documentation that verifies prior satisfactory execution

A qualified evaluator is designated by the candidate's fire academy and holds an equivalent or higher-level certification. If no such evaluator is present, the fire academy shall designate an individual with more experience than the candidate and a demonstrated ability to execute the job performance requirements.

A task book evaluator may be, but is not required to be, a registered skills evaluator who oversees a State Fire Training certification exam.

A certification task book may have more than one evaluator.

All evaluators shall:

- 1. Complete a block on the **Signature Verification** page with a handwritten signature.
- 2. Review and understand the candidate's certification task book requirements and responsibilities.
- Verify the candidate's successful completion of one or more job performance requirements through observation or review.
 - Sign all appropriate lines in the certification task book with a handwritten signature or approved digital signature (e.g. Docusign or Adobe Sign) to record demonstrated performance of tasks.

Fire Chief

The fire chief is the individual who reviews and confirms the completion of a candidate's certification task book.

A fire chief may identify an authorized designee already on file with State Fire Training to fulfill any task book responsibilities assigned to the fire chief. (See *State Fire Training Procedures Manual*, 4.2.2: Authorized Signatories.)

Completion

The fire chief shall:

- 1. Confirm that the candidate has obtained the appropriate signatures to verify successful completion of each job performance requirement.
 - Ensure that all Job Performance Requirements were evaluated after the initiation date.
- 2. Confirm that the candidate meets the **Completion Requirements**.
- 3. Sign and date the Fire Chief verification statement under **Review and Approval** with a handwritten signature.
 - If signing as an authorized designee, verify that your signature is on file with State Fire Training.

Submission and Review

A candidate should not submit a task book until they have completed all requirements and obtained all signatures. State Fire Training will reject and return an incomplete task book.

State Fire Training reviews all submitted task books.

- If the task book is complete, State Fire Training will authorize the task book and retain a digital copy of the authorized task book in the candidate's State Fire Training file.
- If the task book is incomplete, State Fire Training will return the task book with a notification indicating what needs to be completed prior to resubmission.

Completion of this certification task book is one step in the certification process. Please refer to the *State Fire Training Procedures Manual* for the complete list of qualifications required for certification.
