Existing Course Approval

Recommended Actions: Consent

Background Information: This is presented to support the 2023 California Code of Regulations, Title 19: Public Safety, Initial Statement of Reasons and Procedures Manual update. As of today, this approval confirms the existing classes listed below meet the current goals and objectives of the State Fire Training Program.

The program's course list and curriculums are updated as part of a formal process. Each action is formally initiated by a staff report from the OSFM. The Statewide Training and Education Advisory Committee (STEAC) and the State Board of Fire Services (SBFS) review recommendations and formally vote on each motion for change.

Courses are kept in general alignment with national standards, with customizations based on input from professional cadres with experience operating in California conditions. A retirement is used when there is an update to the methods or technology for a specific skill type, or a risk to public safety is newly identified and the is related to the course content.

Analysis/Summary of Issue Standard:

The Office of the State Fire Marshal shall establish course plans and adopt national courses for delivery within the Fire Service Training and Education Program (FSTEP) based on the development of Course Training Standards (CTS) guides for fire

service professional continuing education and topic-specific training courses that do not lead to job function certification. The CTS Guides are incorporated by reference as amended by the OSFM and list the requisite knowledge
