2. Burn Permits

- 1) The LE-100a form will be updated for the upcoming permit renewal
- 2) A social media campaign is being created now to remind residents of the renewal process starting May 1, 2025
- 3) Fiscal year 2024/25 44,504 permits have been issued
- 4) A more comprehensive list of crops to choose from
- 5) Since 5/1/23 156,612 permits have been issued

3. Home Hardening

- New web application should be ready to release the first week of May 2025
- 2) To date: All projects are in process
 - North Coast Opportunities has completed 19 homes, 2 homes are in process
 - ii. San Diego Fire Protection District 2 homes completed, 4 homes in EHP review, 3 homes out for bid with contractors
- 3) Shasta County FSC 2 homes ready for contractor to start, 3 homes have completed required Dspace compliance, 7 new assessments completed and ready for evaluation
- 4) Shasta Valley RCD 16 homes have had trees removed from parcels
- 4. Utility Wildfire Mitigation Program
 - PC&E has submitted their pre-submission WMP that is currently being reviewed
 - 2) The 2026-28 Base WMPs will begin to arrive starting with PG&E on 4/4/25 and the rest of the IOUs will submit with a 2-week offset between utility companies.
 - i. Scheduled completion for all WMPs in mid-November 2025

- b. CalMAPPER V4 implementation is on track for July 1, 2025. A group of qualified individuals from across the state are meeting weekly to start the testing phase of the new product.

5. Pre-Fire Planning

a. The Board of Forestry accepted all the 5-year SRA review changes that were presented as part of the level 5 review on March 5, 2025. These changes will be reflected on the 2025 SRA Map to be implemented on July 1, 2025.

6. CalStats

a. National Emergency Response Information System (NERIS) webinar was held on March 17, 2025. The webinar was successful in providing information to Fire Departments across California on the transition from NFIRS to NERIS.




- 1. Land Use Planning

3. OLD BUSINESS – LA Fires Recovery Update

5. ROUNDTABLE Daniel Berlant

A. Catherine Freeman, California State Association of Counties – CSAC put together a booklet (available on their <u>website</u>) that goes over what the counties' highest priorities are for the next year to get implemented for permanent policies for wildfire preparedness and recovery.

- B. Staci Heaton, Rural County Representatives of California Focusing on federal advocacy this year. There are a couple trips planned to Washington DC focusing on FEMA reforms to talk about some of the things that were discussed today and also wildfire mitigation assistance for home hardening, etc. at the federal level. There's some good legislation with the feds right now and working to move those along.
- C. Steve Hawks, Insurance Institute for Business & Home Safety The second report around the LA fires has been released. This includes initial observations from field deployments. Working on a third report that will be released either later this year or early next year which will be a much deeper dive into what was learned from field deployments. While in the field, they focused on three factors that lead to conflagration structure spacing, connectivity of fuels between structures and the building materials. Looked at the damaged structures from light damage to major damage. They did not look at destroyed structures because there's very little you can learn from them. When you have less than 10' between structures it's very difficult, under those extreme conditions, for a structure that's downwind from a burning structure to withstand that extreme amount of heat for very long. And when there's connected fuels between them it can maneuver to the next property downwind and ignite that structure.
- D. J Lopez, State Board of Forestry & Fire Protection There are two Zone Zero workshops April 7, 2025 and May 12, 2025.
- E. Caroline Thomas Jacobs, Office of Energy Infrastructure Safety There is a <u>Wildfire Mitigation Symposium</u> on March 25, 2025. The department now has its first Chief Deputy Director, Ken DaRosa. He will now act as alternate for this Advisory Committee.
- F. Daniel Berlant, CAL FIRE, Office of the State Fire Marshal The California Wildfire and Forest Resilience Task Force has its Spring Regional Meeting happening next Thursday in Marin County with a focus on community resiliency data sharing. Steve Hawks will be presenting on some of the early insights from the LA fires, and there will be discussions around work happening there in Marin County. Chief Berlant will report out on some of the data risk modeling work that the CAL FIRE team has been doing.

It has been several months since the Governor rolled out his January budget proposal. In addition to the \$200M to the Department for fire prevention and forest health augmented work that would go to supporting our Wildfire Prevention Grant Program, the Climate Bond Proposition 4 sets aside significant funding for Wildfire Resiliency. For next year we are proposing \$82M for forest health projects, \$59M in local fire prevention grants, \$60M in regional projects, \$10M in additional fuel reduction structure hardening, reforestation, and \$3M for prescribed fire, learning hub, and training center. There's an additional \$135M for home hardening and other buckets. There are at least two dozen legislative bills that touch wildfire preparedness. There's a lot of work in the insurance, utility, home hardening defensible space spaces.

6. PUBLIC COMMENT Daniel Berlant

A. Robyn Fennig, CalOES, commented that as of the end of February 2025 the federal government posted on the Federal Register that there in an interim title rule removing the Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) that implement NEPA (National Environmental Policy Act). This will become effective on April 11, 2025 pending public comment.
