

## **Fireworks Coding**



NFIRS contains codes that indicate that an incident or injury was caused by fireworks.

NFIRS data is used at the national, state, and local levels to allocate funding, write legislation, and determine staffing and training needs.





Statistics are queried from the codes selected in the NFIRS reports.

If there is no code selected to indicate that the incident was caused by fireworks, it cannot be included in fireworks statistics.

All 2022 NFIRS data is due by July 1, 2023.

Only valid incidents that were successfully imported by this due date will be included in national statistics and the Public Data Release.
