1990.00. Incorporated References.

Administrative procedures for the California Fire Service Training and Education Program shall consist of the following documents <u>is</u> incorporated by reference: *"State Fire Training Procedures Manual* (May 2020 2025)" and the "Course Information and Required Materials Manual (January 2019)." Registered <u>i</u>Instructors and State Fire Marshal staff shall ensure that all applicable instructions in the incorporated referenced documents are followed to become a <u>rR</u>egistered <u>i</u>Instructor and to instruct State Fire Marshal FSTEP and CFSTES accredited and approved courses.

1990.01. Certification Training Standards.

(a) The Office of the State Fire Marshal shall establish levels of certification based on the development of Certification Training Standards (CTS) guides Index for fire service professional qualifications based on National Standards and developed for specific job functions within the California Fire Service and Training Education <u>System a professional certification track as listed on the OSFM website</u>. The CTS GuidesIndexes are incorporated by reference as amended by the OSFM and <u>listincludes</u> the requisite knowledge, skills and job performance requirements a person is expected to complete for certification in a specific function, course plans, activities, certification exam requirements, skill sheets, certification task books, applications, and instructor documents that are required for certification, course delivery, certification exam delivery, and instructor registration. The following Certification Training Standards Indexes are incorporated by reference as a baseline for performance in each career classification:

(b) The Office of the State Fire Marshal shall establish course plans and adopt national courses for delivery within the Fire Service Training and Education Program and are listed within the Course Training Standards (CoTS) Indexes as listed on the OSFM website. The CoTS Indexes are incorporated by reference as amended by the OSFM and includes the course plans, activities, skill sheets, task books, applications, and instructor documents that are required for course delivery and instructor registration. The following CoTS Indexes are incorporated by reference as a baseline for course delivery and instructor registration:

1990.02. Accredited and Approved Course Curriculum and Course Certificate Completion.

Registered Instructors shall not delete any material from an accredited or approved curriculum, as referenced in the <u>"Course Information and Required Materials Manual (May 2015),"</u> <u>Course Plans</u>, unless approved in writing by the Chief of State Fire Training per Section 1980.06.

(a) This section shall not prohibit registered instructors from adding additional material which exceeds the minimum requirements established for the course curriculum, with the condition that additions do not conflict with the established State standards and recognized procedures pursuant to this regulation.

(b) An accredited course is adopted by the State Fire Marshal (SFM) and includes some form of cognitive examination or evaluation to determine student competency in accordance with Section 1990.03.

(1) A student successfully completing an accredited course shall receive a course completion certificate <u>diploma</u> that can lead to position certification in a specialized career track within the California Fire Service Training and Education System (CFSTES).

(c) A Fire Service Training and Education Program (FSTEP) course is a class approved by the State Fire Marshal.

(1) FSTEP courses may include some form of cognitive or psychomotor evaluation of student competency.

(2) A student successfully completing a (FSTEP) course will receive a course completion certificate <u>diploma</u>. All approved courses are classified as the Fire Service Training and Education Program (FSTEP) which does not lead to certification.

1990.04. Instructors.

All instructors under the California Fire Service Training and Education Program, with the exception of Fire Fighter 1 and Fire Fighter 2 Instructors, shall be registered with the State Fire Training Division following the procedures for each course specialty as outlined in the *State Fire Training Procedures Manual*² per <u>sS</u>ection 1990.00.

(a) Registered Instructors shall meet specific coursework, instructor requirements, teaching experience, rank, and occupational experience. A Registered Instructor can be approved to teach either or both California Fire Service Training and Education System (CFSTES) and Fire Service Training and Education Program (FSTEP) courses.

(1) <u>Senior Registered</u> Instructors shall meet minimum qualifications for accredited and/or approved Rescue related courses per *"State Fire Training Procedures Manual"*, Section 1990.00.

(2) <u>Primary Registered Instructors have the lead responsibility for the delivery of</u> an OSFM CFSTES or FSTEP course per *"State Fire Training Procedures Manual*", Section 1990.00.

(3) Adjunct <u>Assistant</u> Instructors shall meet minimum instructor criteria and work under the supervision of a Primary <u>Registered</u> Instructor for the delivery of an OSFM accredited and approved courses per *"State Fire Training Procedures Manual*", Section 1990.00.

(4) Registered Lead Evaluator<u>s</u>, and Registered Skills Evaluator<u>s</u>, and Exam <u>Proctors</u> shall meet minimum instructor criteria to evaluate student skill demonstrations or exams per *"State Fire Training Procedures Manual"*, Section 1990.00.

(b) Registered Instructors shall notify the State Fire Training Division *via email* of any status change in regard to name, address, telephone number and e-mail address.

(1) Failure to notify the State Fire Training Division as set forth in Section, 1990.04(b) shall result in the Registered Instructor being placed on the inactive list.

(2) Registered Instructors on the inactive list shall be reinstated to the active list if they comply with Section, 1990.04(b).

1990.05. Accredited Facilities.

The Office of the State Fire Marshal, with a recommendation from the State Board of Fire Services (SBFS) and/or the Statewide Training and Education Advisory Committee (STEAC) may designate community colleges as an Accredited Regional Training Program (ARTP) and local fire departments as an Accredited Local Academy (ALA) per the accreditation procedures specified in the *"State Fire Training Procedures Manual"* per Section 1990.00.

(a) An "Accredited Regional Training Program (ARTP)" is a community college in partnership with local fire departments, which has been accredited to deliver OSFM- approved courses as described in the *"State Fire Training Procedures Manual"* per Section 1990.00.

(b) An "Accredited Local Academy (ALA)" is a single fire agency actively providing federal, tribal, state, municipal, county, or district fire protection services (serving a specific authority having jurisdiction), which has been accredited to deliver OSFM- approved courses as described in the *"State Fire Training Procedures Manual"* per Section 1990.00.

(c) An "Accredited Rescue Training Site (ARTS)" is a training facility that meets the site, training prop, tools, and equipment requirements. <u>These</u> for Rescue Systems 1, Rescue Systems 2, and/or Confined Space Rescue requirements must be verified by the Registered Instructor as described in the "*State Fire Training Procedures Manual*" per Section 1990.00.

(d) These facilities shall be cited as "accredited facilities" in these regulations

1990.06. Safety Policy.

All Registered Instructors who are conducting a State Fire Training Marshal accredited or approved course shall have, when appropriate, a safety plan as part of the instructional process. The plan shall address, but is not limited to, the following elements: safe operating procedures, location of exits, emergency notification phone numbers for staff and students, location of first aid equipment, and the locations of appropriate medical facilities. The safety plan shall include verification of the required Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) as detailed in the Course Plan. This safety plan shall be communicated to the students at the beginning of the class.

1990.08. Suspension, <u>Decertification</u>, or Revocation, <u>or Expulsion</u>.

An action to suspend, deny, or revoke certification; to suspend of decertify a certification exam or course; to suspend or revoke a Registered Instructor, Registered Lead Evaluator, a Registered Skills Evaluator, or Accredited Academy; or to suspend or expel a student, candidate, or applicant may be taken by a Supervising Deputy State Fire Marshal when:

(a) There is no longer a demonstrated need for the course as determined by the Statewide Training and Education Advisory Committee (STEAC) and State Board of Fire Service (SBFS), or

(b) There is failure to comply with requirements set forth in Regulations 1980-1990, or (c) There is an integrity, code of conduct, or ethics violation, in accordance with the Instructor Code of Conduct/Ethics, the State Fire Training Procedures Manual, as incorporated by reference, or

(d) There is a violation or threat to public safety, or

(e) There are other violations warranting denial of certification, suspension, and/or decertification as determined by State Fire Training.

Corrective action shall be taken to ensure compliance with the procedures and ethical conduct of the OSFM and to call to attention any problems that have been reported regarding Registered Instructors, Registered Lead Evaluators, Registered Skills Evaluators, Accredited Facilities, and/or Host Facilities.

(a) A written negative comment shall be investigated and corrected, if necessary, by the Chief of State Fire Training.

(b) Written negative comments will serve as documentation in the Registered Instructors, Registered Lead Evaluators, Registered Skills Evaluators, Accredited Facilities, and/or Host Facilities file as an infraction or breach in procedures or ethical conduct in accordance with Section 1990.00. Written negative comments shall form the basis for the OSFM to investigate on the validity and seriousness of the comment.

(c) An investigation that uncovers breaches of procedures or an ethical violation may lead to a notice of suspension or revocation of Registered Instructors, Registered Lead Evaluators, Registered Skills Evaluators, Accredited Facility, and/or Host Facility accreditation.

(d) Suspension of Registered iInstructors, Registered Lead Evaluators, Registered Skills Evaluators, Accredited Facility, and/or Host Facility accreditation shall be based on documented evidence of breaches in procedures or ethical conduct. The Instructor or Accredited Facility shall receive a written notice of the proposed suspension that will include the specific details of the infractions and 60 days, to respond in writing, before the suspension takes effect. The written notice shall contain information on the appeal process to the suspension.

(1) State Fire Training has the authority to suspend a class or instructor if a violation or threat to public safety has occurred. Such an action shall be documented by the State Fire Training representative and the instructor shall be required to cease all instructional activities immediately.

(e) Revocation of Registered iInstructors, Registered Lead Evaluators, Registered Skills Evaluators, Accredited Facility, and/or Host Facility accreditation shall be based on documented evidence of breaches in procedures or ethical conduct in accordance with Section 1990.00. This action may be heard administratively. The Registered iInstructors, Registered Lead Evaluators, Registered Skills Evaluators, Accredited Facility, and/or Host Facility will receive written notification that shall include specific details of breaches in procedures or ethical conduct and the penalty proposed from the Chief of State Fire Training. (1) The written notice of revocation to a Registered iInstructors, Registered Lead Evaluators, Registered Skills Evaluators, Accredited Facility, and/or Host Facility shall include the specific details of the infractions, and revocation shall be effective immediately upon receipt of the notice. The written notice shall contain information on how to appeal the revocation.

(f) An investigation that uncovers ethical violations or infractions by students and/or classes may lead to a notice of suspension, certification recantation, criminal charges, and/or SFT system expulsion for up to two years. Such action shall be based on documented evidence of ethical violations or infraction. The student and/or class shall receive a written notice of the proposed punitive action that will include the specific details of the infractions and 60 days to respond in writing before the suspension takes effect. The written notice shall contain information on the appeal process to the suspension.

(1) State Fire Training has the authority to suspend a student or class if a violation or threat to public safety has occurred. Such an action shall be documented by the State Fire Training representative.

1990.09. Appeals Process.

(a) Any action to suspend or deny certification; to suspend or decertify a certification exam or course; to suspend or revoke a Registered Instructor, Registered Lead Evaluator, a Registered Skills Evaluator, or an accredited academy; or to suspend or expel a student, candidate, or applicant may be appealed to the Chief of State Fire Training. The appeal and all relevant documentation the appellant believes supports the appeal, must be submitted in writing and received by the Chief of State Fire Training within thirty (30) calendar days of the Supervising Deputy State Fire Marshal's notification of denial of certification, suspension, decertification, or revocation.

Within thirty (30) calendar days of receiving the appeal, the Chief of State Fire Training shall respond to the appellant in writing with a decision affirming, reversing or modifying the decision of the Supervising Deputy State Fire Marshal, and provide the reasons for the decision. In the event the Chief of State Fire Training is unavailable due to vacancy, conflict of interest, incapacitation, or other circumstance then an Assistant Deputy Director or Deputy Director may serve in their place.

(b) The decision of the Chief of State Fire Training may be appealed to the STEAC Appeals Committee. The appeal and all relevant documentation the appellant believes support their appeal, must be submitted in writing and received by State Fire Training (SFT) within thirty (30) calendar days of the date of the decision of the Chief of State Fire Training.

Appeals received at least thirty (30) calendar days prior to the next scheduled STEAC Appeals Committee meeting will be heard at that meeting. Appeals

received with less than thirty (30) days remaining prior to the next scheduled STEAC Appeals Committee meeting will be heard at a subsequent meeting. State Fire Training shall notify the appellant in writing of the date, time, and location of the hearing within 10 calendar days of the receipt of the appeal by the State Fire Training.

At an appeal hearing, the burden of proof is on the appellant to demonstrate to the STEAC Appeals Committee that an error was committed by SFT staff in its decision (refer to State Fire Training Procedures Manual Section 2.1.4.5 for STEAC Appeals Process).

The Chief of State Fire Training shall notify the appellant in writing of the STEAC's decision within 15 calendar days following the conclusion of the hearing.

(a) The first level of appeal shall occur with the Registered Instructor, Registered Lead Evaluator, Registered Skills Evaluator, Accredited Facility, and/or Host Facility submitting, in writing, to the Assistant State Fire Marshal all evidence to support reversing the suspension or revocation action within 60 days of receiving their notice of suspension or revocation. The Registered Instructor, Registered Lead Evaluator, Registered Skills Evaluator, Accredited Facility, and/or Host Facility may request in writing an administrative hearing, conducted by the Assistant State Fire Marshal to fully examine the issues. If the Assistant State Fire Marshal is unavailable due to vacancy, conflict of interest, incapacitation, or other circumstance, the appeal will be directed to an Assistant Deputy Director.

(1) After review of all submitted materials and/or testimony provided during an administrative hearing, the Assistant State Fire Marshal shall, by written letter, notify the Registered Instructor, Registered Lead Evaluator, Registered Skills Evaluator, Accredited Facility, or Host Facility and State Fire Training of the decision to uphold, modify, or withdraw the action along with the next level of the appeal process within 45 days. If the Assistant State Fire Marshal is unavailable due to vacancy, conflict of interest, incapacitation, or other circumstance, the written letter will be provided by an Assistant Deputy Director.

(b) The second level of the appeal process shall occur with the Registered Instructor, Registered Lead Evaluator, Registered Skills Evaluator, Accredited Facility, or Host Facility submitting, in writing, to the Statewide Training and Education Advisory Committee (STEAC) all evidence to support reversing the suspension or revocation action within 60 days of receiving the Assistant State Fire Marshal's decision. The Assistant State Fire Marshal shall agendize this request at the next regularly scheduled STEAC meeting.

(1) After review of all submitted materials and/or testimony provided during an administrative hearing, STEAC shall, by written letter, notify the Registered Instructor, Registered Lead Evaluator, Registered Skills Evaluator, Accredited Facility, or Host Facility and State Fire Training of the decision to uphold, modify, or withdraw the action along with the next level of the appeal process within 45 days of their decision.

(c) The third level of the appeal process shall occur with the Registered Instructor, Registered Lead Evaluator, Registered Skills Evaluator, Accredited Facility, or Host Facility submitting, in writing, to the State Fire Marshal, all evidence to support reversing the suspension or revocation action within 60 days of being notified by STEAC of their decision. If the State Fire Marshal is unavailable due to vacancy, conflict of interest, incapacitation, or other circumstance, the appeal will be directed to an Assistant Deputy Director or Deputy Director.

(1) The State Fire Marshal shall, by written letter, notify the Registered Instructor, Registered Lead Evaluator, Registered Skills Evaluator, Accredited Facility, or Host Facility and State Fire Training of the decision to uphold, modify or withdraw the action within 60 days of the date of the appeal. If the State Fire Marshal is unavailable due to vacancy, conflict of interest, incapacitation, or other circumstance, the written letter will be provided by an Assistant Deputy Director or Deputy Director.

1990.10. Reinstatement.

SFT may reinstate a Registered Instructor, Registered Lead Evaluator, Registered Skills Evaluator, Exam Proctor, Accredited Academy, host agency/facility, student, candidate, or applicant if they meet all terms of disciplinary action, reapplies for registration, certification, accreditation, and testing, and meets all current requirements.

Reinstatement as a Registered iInstructors, Registered Lead Evaluators, Registered Skills Evaluators, Accredited Facility, and/or Host Facility shall be achieved by meeting all terms of disciplinary action and by reapplying and meeting the current requirements as a Registered Instructor, Lead Skills Evaluator, Skills Evaluator, Accredited Facility, and/or Host Facility.

1990.11. Instructor Orientation and Classroom Ethics.

All Registered Instructors shall complete State Fire Trainings "Regional Registered Instructors Orientation," "Ethical Leadership in the Classroom for Instructors," and any OSFM-required instructor update training programs before a CFSTES or FSTEP course request will be approved by State Fire Training.

(a) Training curriculum that is significantly updated by the OSFM may require an update class to bring current instructors up-to-date on changes to the training program. Current instructors will be notified of any classes that require their attendance in an update class. Failure to attend an update class may result in being removed as an approved instructor for that class. **Note:** Authority cited: Sections 13159(d) and 13159.8(a), Health and Safety Code. Reference: Sections 13159(d) and 13159.8(a), Health and Safety Code.

1990.12. State Fire Training Fees.

State Fire Training shall establish and collect fees necessary to support the California Fire Service Training and Education Program. The following fees have been approved and adopted by the Office of the State Fire Marshal as recommended by the Statewide Training and Education Advisory Committee:
