

 - The proposals shall meet the 9 point criteria
 - 1. The proposals do not conflict with, overlap, or duplicate other building standards.
 - 2. The proposals are within the parameters established by enabling legislation, and are not expressly within the exclusive jurisdiction of another agency.
 - The public interest requires the adoption of the building standards. The public interest includes, but is not limited to, health and safety, resource efficiency, fire safety, seismic safety, building and building system performance, and consistency with environmental, public health, and accessibility statutes and regulations.
 - 4. The proposals are not unreasonable, arbitrary, unfair, or capricious, in whole or in part.
 - 5. The cost to the public is reasonable, based on the overall benefit to be derived from the proposals.

- 6. The proposals are not unnecessarily ambiguous or vague, in whole or in part.
- 7. The applicable national specifications, published standards, and model codes have been incorporated therein as provided in this part, where appropriate.
- 8. The format of the proposal is consistent with that adopted by CBSC.
- 9. The proposal, if they promote fire and panic safety as determined by the State Fire Marshal, have the written approval of the State Fire Marshal.
