There's a pre inspection form that you can complete before the fire department. This is free, but you don't have to have an application filed with community care licensing to request a service. Here is a link – <u>LIC 9092</u>

- c. Evacuation cribs and aprons
- d. Alternate means does not mitigate the need of fire sprinklers
- e. Waiver or greater flexibility for zero to 5 restrictions.
