

Startup Plan

A startup plan outlines the steps for safely restarting the pipelines. The Office of the State Fire Marshal will review the plan and conduct inspections to ensure compliance.



The Office of the State Fire Marshal (OSFM) works with operators to ensure restart plans meet federal and state safety standards per 49 USC 60100 et seq., 49 CFR Part 195, and the California Pipeline Safety Act.

- If additional permits or environmental documents are needed for a restart, OSFM directs operators to the correct agencies, as these fall outside OSFM jurisdiction.

OSFM oversees only the onshore hazardous liquid pipelines (CA-324 and CA-325).

Other agencies regulate the Las Flores Canyon facility, onshore gas pipelines, offshore platforms, and offshore pipelines. These include:

- Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA) – Western Region
- California State Lands Commission
- Bureau of Safety and Environmental Enforcement (BSEE)
- California State Parks
- California Coastal Commission
- Santa Barbara County
- United States Coast Guard

- California Fish and Wildlife – Office of Oil Spill Prevention and Response
- Bureau of Land Management
- California Geologic Energy Management Division (CalGEM)
- Gas Safety and Reliability Branch of the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC)

Sable must submit a two-part restart plan:

- **Compliance Document:** Shows how Sable meets legal requirements.

Operations Document: Provides a detailed, step-by-step guide for restarting pipeline operations, including measures to protect public safety and the environment.
