Description: This course provides the skills needed to operate a personal watercraft (PWC)

and perform rescue in river and flood situations. Safety, course philosophy, and PWC terminology are covered. "In water" experiences for students include how to read dynamics flow for safety travel, perform self- rescue and victim-rescue operations, along with executing pre/post-inspections of the

PWC.

Time Table Key
