

## **Certification Exam Overview**

This document outlines the State Fire Training (SFT) Certification Examination procedure. For a comprehensive guide on the exam program, refer to Chapter 11 of the SFT Procedures Manual.

The Fire Fighter 1 and 2 Certification Exams consist of cognitive and skills tests. Relevant Skill Sheets are available on the Fire Fighter page of the SFT website.

The Fire Fighter 1 Certification Exam includes three test modules: Fire Fighter 1A: Structure, Fire Fighter 1B: Hazardous Materials/WMD, and Fire Fighter 1C: Wildland FF 1. These modules can be taken either after completion of the respective training or at the end of all Fire Fighter 1 academic training.

The Fire Fighter 2 Certification Exam contains one test module, Fire Fighter 2A: Structure, which can be taken after the training is complete.

Candidates wishing to take the exam at a different site from their training location must provide the testing site with relevant exam eligibility documents, such as an Exam Authorization form, Training Record, and/or signed Skills Sheets, Alternate Delivery Waiver, or SFT Student Course (Exam) Transcript.

# **Test Site Policy**

This is a closed-book examination. Any materials brought to the exam site must be left in an unattended area at the candidate's risk.

# **Reasonable Accommodations**

SFT uses accredited testing sites for high-stakes certification exams. These sites may review and approve disability-related accommodations on behalf of SFT. Reasonable accommodations are available for candidates with disabilities who meet legal requirements, including applicable national laws and regulations, ensuring that they have full access to exams.

Accommodations are personalized and considered individually. Candidates requesting accommodations due to a disability must provide documentation of their condition and how it would impact their ability to test under standard conditions. All candidates, including those needing accommodations, must adhere to the same exam security and administration procedures.

## **Cognitive Test Strategy**

This is a multiple-choice exam, with each question offering four options. Only one of these is the BEST answer. Unanswered questions will score zero points. If you're unsure, it's better to attempt an answer than to leave it blank. Sufficient time is given to read and respond to all questions, so make sure to carefully read each question and its options before choosing the BEST answer.

# Fire Fighter 1B: Hazardous Materials/WMD

## **Exam Entry Requirements**

Complete the Fire Fighter 1B: HazMat/WMD academic training and provide applicable verification of exam eligibility.

## **Cognitive Exam**

There are two sections to the Fire Fighter 1B Cognitive Exam:

- Fire Fighter 1B: HazMat First Responder Awareness
  - -> 25 questions with a time limit of 30 minutes. Up to two retakes are permitted within 30 days.
- Fire Fighter 1B: HazMat First Responder Operations/PPE/PC

-> 25 questions with a time limit of 30 minutes. Up to two retakes are permitted within 30 days.

- a. Skill 3-1 can utilize the alternate psychomotor skill evaluation if a registered Fire Control 4 course is being taught within the Fire Fighter 2A module.
- b. Skill 3-2 can utilize the alternate psychomotor skill evaluation if a registered Fire Control 4 course is being taught within the Fire Fighter 2A module.
- c. Skill 4-1 can utilize the alternate psychomotor skill evaluation if a registered Vehicle Extrication course is being taught within the Fire Fighter 2A module.



# **Certification Exam Information**

The Certification Exam for Fire Fighter 1 and 2 contains both a cognitive and skills exam.

## **Cognitive Exam**

All cognitive exams are multiple-choice and conducted online at accredited testing sites. Candidates need to score at least 70% to pass. Exam results are displayed immediately upon completion and can also be accessed via the SFT User Portal.

## **Retake Eligibility**

Candidates seeking to retake a skills exam must present their SFT Student Course (Exam) Transcript from the SFT User Portal at the testing site to confirm their eligibility for a retake.

Exception: Verification of retake eligibility is not required for candidates from accredited academies who have completed their academic training and all certification exams at the ARTP or ALA administering the certification exam, provided there has been no interruption in their training.

## <u>Retakes</u>

A candidate who does not pass a cognitive exam (a score lower than 70%) will be allowed to retake the cognitive exam module up to two times within the academy duration or within 30 days of the first attempt. If a candidate can't complete the exam in the given timeframe, they must seek remedial education before reapplying for any SFT Certification Exams.

## **Skills Exam**

To pass the skills exam, a candidate must successfully complete 100% of the assigned skills and 100% of the skills steps in each scenario. An unsafe act committed during the skills exam shall be grounds for a failing score. The skills evaluator will notify the candidate of a pass or fail score upon completion of the skills station. Blank skill sheets, for training and studying, are published on the respective certification page on the SFT website under Training Documentation.

## **Retake Eligibility**

Candidates seeking to retake a skills exam must present their SFT Student Course (Exam) Transcript from the SFT User Portal at the testing site to confirm their eligibility for a retake.

Exception: Verification of retake eligibility is not required for candidates from accredited academies who have completed their academic training and all certification exams at the ARTP or ALA administering the certification exam, provided there has been no interruption in their training.

## <u>Retakes</u>

Candidates who fail a skill station will have up to two opportunities to retake it either within the academy duration or within 30 days of the first attempt. If a candidate can't complete the exam in the given timeframe, they must seek remedial education before reapplying for any SFT Certification Exams.

Upon a failed first attempt, the Registered Lead Evaluator assesses the candidate's failure and determines if a retake is permitted. If allowed, a different Registered Skills Evaluator administers the retake, documents the attempt, and forwards the results to the Lead Evaluator.



The same process is followed for the second retake. All attempts and reattempts align with SFT procedures, and candidates meeting SFT criteria may have same-day reattempts. If a reattempt isn't authorized, the candidate will be escorted from the exam site.

## **Skills and Cognitive Remediation**

If a candidate fails either the skills or cognitive exam, they are required to undergo a complete retraining of the failed module before reattempting the exam.

Upon completion of the retraining, the candidate should acquire the following documents from the approved instructor:

- A newly completed Fire Fighter Training Record for each module
- A letter signed by the approved instructor verifying that the candidate has retrained on the entire module, including both skills and cognitive materials and activities for each module

Candidates who have completed remediation training are eligible to retake the SFT Certification Exam(s).

Those who undergo remedial training must submit the documents specified in SFT Procedures Manual: 11.8: Skills and Cognitive Remediation, item B, as part of their application.

## **Certification Exam Results**

Results will be made available in the SFT User Portal when processing is complete.

# **Sample Questions**

Below are two examples of cognitive examination question items. The correct answer is marked with an asterisk (\*).

- 1. Roles and responsibilities for Fire Fighter 1 include which of the following?
  - a. Assist special rescue team operations
  - b. Coordinate an interior attack line team
  - c. Respond on apparatus to an emergency scene\*
  - d. Prepare reports
- 2. Which of the following is not typically a type of incident to which fire departments respond?
  - a. Motor vehicle collisions
  - b. Hazardous materials spills
  - c. Vicious dogs on the loose\*
  - d. Emergency medical requests

Note: All test questions (and skills) are reviewed and locally validated by the California Fire Service.
