Section Change: Updated section 9.1: Course Equivalency and Reciprocity

Justification: SFT become nationally accredited in 2016 with the Pro Board and IFSAC

for our Fire Fighter 1 certification in 2016. When SFT became accredited, a

reciprocity program was established for out of state and DoD

certifications. The reciprocity program was limited to the SFT Fire Fighter 1 certification. SFT will now accept IFSAC and Pro Board certifications as course equivalencies. Some certification tracks will require that the candidate completes additional SFT courses to ensure that the student has specific knowledge for working in California. IFSAC and Pro Board certification cannot be used to meet course prerequisites, until after the applicant has completed the course equivalency process with SFT.
