

INFORMATION BULLETIN Skills Coach

OVERVIEW

A new Skills Coach position has been implemented to assist the Registered Primary Instructor with the Psychomotor skills practice within a CFSTES or FSTEP course. This is a separate classification from Registered Psychomotor Skills Evaluator. The CFSTES or FSTEP course plan will indicate if a Skills Coach can be used for course delivery. Additionally, the course plan will indicate the Student-to-Skills Coach ratio and/or the Registered Instructor/Fire Fighter Instructor to Skills Coach Ratio.

COURSE DELIVERY RESPONSIBILITIES

In 2019, SFT proposed the implementation of Skills Coach in three phases. These recommendations have been reviewed by the Steering Committee. The Skills Coach is in addition to the required Registered Instructors and supports curriculum delivery. Skills Coaches are optional, and not a required member of the cadre.

It shall be noted on each Course Plan that a Skills Coach cannot oversee or supervise students during high-risk operations. This includes but is not limited to open trench operations, high angle or rope rescue operations, live-fire operations, or swift water rescue.

CURRICULUM

The following curriculum has been reviewed and updated for the optional use of Skills Coach positions:
